Our meeting opened with a Prayer for Mother and Child, from Page 4 of our new "Prayers and Guides for Keeping Vigil at Abortion Clinics," put together by Bernie. We have printed 50 copies of the booklets that include ecumenical prayers and Scripture readings suitable for use during Jericho Walks.

Reminders & Reports

Bernie reminded us that Fr. Ed says **audible prayer**, singing, etc., **during Adoration** of the Blessed Sacrament should be **limited to 10-15 minutes per hour**, with remainder reserved for only silent prayer.

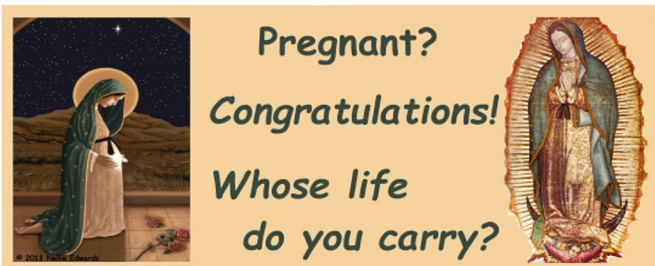
Gina suggests each of us extend personal invitations to friends to increase our numbers for future pro-life rallies.

The Spiritual Adoptions promotion begun last fall will conclude with a May ACCW drive to "shower" Pregnancy Aid with baby items to be collected at St. Stephen's in May. Respect Life Ministry will buy the cake and help ACCW serve it with coffee (instead of the usual donuts) after all Masses May 27-28. We'll wear our pro-life shirts.

There'll be a narthex display with baby shawls donated by the Prayer Shawl Ministry, the fetal development posters and paper hearts that are part of the Spiritual Adoptions display in the narthex, our fetal models, and a "Dollars for Diapers" donations box.

Gina, Lisa, and Kathleen are planning some little "games," consisting of questions for families that will earn on-the-spot little prizes for correct answers. The prizes will be pieces of candy or little pro-life items and/or maybe the new **Human Life Alliance (HLA) "Life Begins" comic books**; see <https://www.humanlife.org/product/life-begins/>.

We are sponsoring 40 days of prayer vigils at Kent Valley Planned Parenthood. St. John the Baptist Covington parishioner Linda led 40 Days for Life in Kent last year. Sidewalk vigil schedules are posted online at <http://ststephenslife.com/kent-lent-for-life>. The national 40 Days for Life is designed for groups able to provide broader coverage than we can, so we are not affiliated with the nation group.

We urge participants to sign up online or in SSTM's narthex. Continuous vigil time/shift signups throughout the day allow banners and signs to pass from one prayer team to another, on site.

Kathleen reminded us to take info brochures and more in packets for needy people to the sidewalk. Please see downloadable DOCUMENTS on the left at <http://ststephenslife.com/kent-lent-for-life> that include items to print and take to the sidewalk. PRE-PARES is listed in the recently updated info brochure.

Kathleen suggests we get a space accessible to all at SSTM (maybe in the narthex) where participants may pick up packet handouts to take to the sidewalk.

Noteworthy dates include:

- **March 1st**, Ash Wednesday kick-off with **Day 1** of the 7-day **Jericho Walk (Joshua 6:1-27)**;
- **March 7, Jericho Walk Day 7**, 7 times around with trumpet blasts and shouting; and
- **April 8, 5pm SSTM Mass, potluck, closing candlelight vigil at Kent Planned Parenthood.**
